Course Tutors:

DR GABRIEL HEMERY is Chief Executive of the Sylva Foundation. He has considerable practical hands-on experience in land management, extensive knowledge of the forest sector and is a specialist in hardwood forestry research (with a doctorate in walnut research).

ALISTAIR YEOMANS has worked as a tree surgeon at the Arnold Arboretum of Harvard University; restored ancient olive groves in Mallorca; and has read Forestry and its Relation to Land Use (MSc) at the University of Oxford. He is now the Director of Forestry at the Sylva Foundation and coordinates the Sylva Foundation's myForest service.

ROBERT PENN is an author, journalist, TV presenter and cyclist. In 2012 he presented Tales from the Wild Wood - a six-part series about British woodlands broadcast on BBC4. The series explored the great British love affair with trees.

DR NICK BROWN is a University Lecturer in the Department of Plant Sciences, University of Oxford, and the Principal of Linacre College. He works with the UN Environment Programme on a number of forestry projects in parts of the developing world impacted by war and natural disaster. He is chair of the Wytham Woods management committee, and chair of the board of trustees for the Sylva Foundation.

DR SARAH SIMBLET is a trained fine artist who specialises in drawing, and has written and illustrated three major art reference books published worldwide by Dorling Kindersley. She is a visiting tutor at the University of Oxford Ruskin School of Drawing and Fine Art. Sarah is currently co-authoring The New Sylva as the Artist-in-Residence for the Sylva Foundation.

This course is designed for people who have an interest in trees and woodlands. The course will look at England's woodlands from a historical, cultural and practical perspective and provide an overview of the University of Oxford's forestry research programme.

However in recent decades the care and management of England's woodlands has declined. Additionally our woodlands are now facing unprecedented threats from environmental change, pests and diseases.

However, 2013 has been heralded as a turning point for the fortunes of English Woodlands. This course will detail how a revival of a 'wood culture' in England will lead to a greater appreciation of how working with our woodlands sustainably can ensure that they continue to contribute to our quality of life.
